

Brook Knoll Elementary School Reading Assistance Pilot Project

In the spring of 1998, Erin Duncan, now owner of Read America Clinic, worked with Brook Knoll Elementary School in Scotts Valley, California, to conduct a pilot reading assistance project using the Phono-Graphix® reading and spelling method.

The 15 participants were identified by their fifth grade (US, ages 10-11) teachers as the very lowest-level readers, struggling with the fundamental skills needed for successful reading. Their teachers and principal were concerned about these students entering middle school (US) the following year, where no more reading instruction was likely to be provided. All were concerned that these students would have difficulty with the work required of them in sixth grade.

The children were pulled from their regular classrooms to receive instruction in groups of five. Each group met for an hour, approximately three times per week, as other school activities permitted. The program, started very late in the school year, lasted only eight weeks, giving an average of just over 10.2 hours of group instruction per child.

The Phono-Graphix Reading Subskills Diagnostic Test was administered before instruction began and upon completion of the project. Every student showed some improvement in his/her skills:

Brook Knoll's principal, Kathy Frandle, administered pre- and post-tests of Word Identification and Word Attack, subtests of the Woodcock Reading Mastery Test – Revised, forms G and H. Average gains were over a year in Word Identification and nearly three years in Word Attack:

Brook Knoll's principal reports that the parents of the participating students were thrilled. One parent wrote the following letter about her daughter's progress:

Thank you for giving [my daughter] the opportunity to improve her reading skills. I do not have sophisticated tests available to measure effectiveness. However, I can tell you that her reading confidence is definitely stronger! For the first time since I can remember (at least two years), [my daughter] offered to read a story to her brother and me. This was the same child who couldn't be coaxed to read to us a few months ago (I finally gave up asking her).

Brook Knoll has continued this reading assistance program independently, having trained several teachers and aides for that purpose. The program was expanded to include fourth-grade students (US) the following year, with a plan to extend the program further in the coming years, to help students of all grades. Further, Brook Knoll and the other elementary school in its district have provided Phono-Graphix training for every teacher, from kindergarten through fifth grade.
